5th Grade English Language Arts (ELA) will provide students with fun and challenging opportunities to learn and practice skills related to reading, writing, grammar, vocabulary, speaking, and listening.

The 5th Grade ELA curriculum is designed to support students in developing skills and confidence in the three types of writing: narrative, argumentative, and informational. The curriculum also emphasizes helping students learn to read critically and to find deeper meanings. Students will be guided through the subtleties of reading and writing, such as inferences, themes, imagery, figurative language, as well as sentence variety and word choice. I intend to foster a love of reading, thereby creating lifelong readers, learners, and leaders.

Common Core Language standards (related to grammar, vocabulary, speaking, and listening) are taught both implicitly through the Reading and Writing units of study as well as explicitly through a version of the workshop model.

- 5.6 Analyze multiple accounts of the same event or topic, noting important similarities and differences in the point of view they represent.
- 5.7 Draw on information from multiple print or digital sources, demonstrating the ability to locate an answer to a question quickly or to solve a problem efficiently.

- 5.9 Integrate information from several texts on the same topic in order to write or speak about the subject knowledgeably.

• Writing
